Being green at BCEC





We are committed to environmental and sustainable practices that reduce our footprint on the planet.

BCEC has achieved earthcheck platinum accreditation, incorporating 13 years of rigorous recertification audits. The globally-recognised certification ensures the centre's compliance with the highest international environmental standards, including these integral programs.



Daylight harvesting

The installation of new LED lighting and a daylight harvesting system within the Centre's foyers, exhibition halls, and concourse has resulted in a 50% reduction in energy demand.



Rainwater harvesting

BCEC captures 1,000,000 litres of rainwater, stored in 2 subterranean tanks. This harvested rainwater is then reticulated around the facility for sanitation and irrigation requirements.



Going solar

A 764-solar-panel system supplies 40% of the baseload power requirements for the BCEC Grey Street Building, with further solar panel installation planned for the Centre.



Food wastage

'Herbie', the Centre's organic dehydrator, helps reduce organic waste from the Centre's busy kitchens by up to 80%, turning waste into high concentrate soil fertiliser able to be used in the community across Brisbane.

BCEC recycles lamps and batteries through Ecocycle, mercury recovery and recycling specialists, as a signatory to FluroCycle, which seeks to increase the national recycling rate of mercury-containing lamps on behalf of Australia's National Waste Policy.
